Independent, bipartisan Commission established by the Help America Vote Act (HAVA).



Develops guidance to meet HAVA requirements.



Adopts voluntary voting system guidelines, certifies voting systems and accredits testing laboratories.



Serves as a national clearinghouse of information on election administration.



Distributes, administers, and audits the use of HAVA funds.



Maintains the National Mail Voter Registration Form.

2023 EAC by the Numbers








Held 16 in-person & virtual events Commissioners traveled to 32 states, 3 territories & D.C.



2024 Election Readiness Checklist

Includes items such as:



Secure election equipment



Evaluate physical and procedural security



Proof and test your voting materials



2024 Readiness Checklist: Prepare for Success



Keep transparency in mind.

Design processes that ensure **poll watchers** have proper access and implement **best practices for public records requests**. Invite the press and the public to visit your facilities and witness pre-election processes.

Build community relationships.

Engage with your stakeholders early and frequently. Go beyond your voters: partner with **community organizations**, lawmakers, political parties, and elected officials.

Keep your voter lists updated.

Make sure all activities related to voter roll maintenance are up-to-date, including any state-specific processes required by law.

Have a communications plan.

Position your office as the trusted source for information in your community. Pay special attention to groups, like **media** and **new voters**. Ahead of time, prepare **FAQ guides**, have a **PR strategy in place**, and get ahead of **what happens after Election Day**.

Review changes in legislation.

Most legislative sessions will have delivered changes to election laws by this time. Ensure you have reviewed all the changes, including any changes in **district boundaries**.

Create the election project baseline.

This includes preparing your election calendar and reviewing your SOPs.

Develop a risk management plan.

Be prepared for unforeseen situations and make sure you have **contingency plans** in place, including all logistical areas and **supply chain considerations**.

Prepare for in-person voting.


Start recruitment of poll workers early. Use the simulators available to ensure you have sufficient resources to respond to changes in the voting process, the number of locations, and also detect potential line issues.

Ensure accessibility requirements are met.

Accessibility starts at **voter registration**. Review needs for all voting methods: **by mail** and **in-person** (plus **curbside**). Consider **Language accessibility**, including **unwritten languages** in your community.







Awarded the full \$1 million in available HAVCP funding:


- 14 Poll Worker Grants totaling \$937,050



VVSG 2.0

In 2021, the EAC updated voluntary standards for voting systems to lay the groundwork for 21st century voting systems that will significantly improve cybersecurity, accessibility, and usability requirements.

The EAC is a resource for election officials to help guide them through the VVSG 2.0 migration process - from procurement to implementation.

To help state and local jurisdictions in the transition to VVSG 2.0, the EAC is consistently releasing resources to assist election officials in communicating about the migration of these standards and reassuring the public that our voting systems remain secure and accurate.




